Master of Arts (MA) in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL)

The MA in TESOL combines the development of practical teaching skills with strong theoretical underpinning in key areas of applied linguistics and language learning. Great emphasis is placed on the use of digital technologies in teaching, which are of increasing importance for language teaching professionals pursuing successful careers.

Master of Arts (MA) in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL)

Overview

The MA in TESOL is designed to provide professional development opportunities for speakers of English who wish to pursue or further their careers as TESOL professionals. It will equip participants with the knowledge and professional skills relevant to teaching and supporting the learning of English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL). Participants will acquire independent learning and transferable skills required for continuing professional development in ever-changing, current and future educational contexts. Digital technologies are becoming increasingly prevalent in TESOL, and this is reflected in the program, which focuses on the use of educational technology and digital resources through its content and through the way it is delivered.

Student & Graduate Profile

The two-track approach (Practicum & Thesis) of the MA in TESOL is ideal for:

- Recent university or college graduates from all backgrounds – or working professionals in other fields – who want to start a career in English language teaching.
- Working language teaching professionals with some experience and qualifications who wish to acquire advanced knowledge of English language teaching theory and practice, extend their skills, and obtain an advanced qualification to further their careers.

Graduates of the program can pursue careers in the field of TESOL, including: teaching, academic management, teacher training, exams, educational technology, and materials writing - or further academic study.

Program Structure

Students must successfully complete 12 graduate-level courses, representing a total of 36 US credits. Students choose either the Practicum Track or Thesis Track part-way through the program. The Practicum Track includes Deree's validated Trinity College London CertTESOL initial teacher training course, an internationally recognized qualification.

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the program, participants should be able to:

- Demonstrate the teaching and associated skills required to perform as a TESOL professional.
- Explain the key concepts and theories underpinning TESOL and current professional issues in the field.
- Describe English as a linguistic system and relate it to language skills development and approaches to teaching and learning.
- Identify and appraise how educational technologies and digital media can be utilized in TESOL.
- Design and implement research initiatives in TESOL using appropriate methods and methodologies.

Trinity College CertTESOL

Deree's validated Trinity College London CertTESOL initial teacher training course, which is included in the Practicum Track on the MA in TESOL program, is appropriate for students with little or no prior qualifications or teaching experience. Students will undergo external assessment and moderation from a Trinity College examiner in order to qualify for the certificate. The CertTESOL is widely recognized and is accepted by the British Council as an initial TESOL qualification for teachers in its accredited teaching organizations in the UK, and in its own teaching operations overseas. There are many jobs available worldwide for individuals with a recognized certificate in TESOL, especially when accompanied by the prestige of an MA.

Flexible Study & Course Duration

The MA in TESOL is taught using a blended approach of face-to-face classes and online study. Each 3-credit course has 18 in-class hours, 18 hours online and 3 hours of assessment. Face-to-face classes run every second Saturday from 10:00-13:00 and/or 14:00-17:00, making attendance convenient even for students outside Attica. For each course, on-campus attendance is required for 6 weeks in the fall, winter, and spring terms. Online activity is ongoing throughout the courses, and involves collaboration with other participants, as well as individual work, all under the supervision of an instructor. The program may be completed in one year (full-time) or up to three years (part-time). New students are admitted at the start of fall, winter, and spring terms. Completing the program in one year is possible only for students who begin their studies in the fall term.

Career Services & Placement Opportunities

The program fosters relationships with domestic Greek and international employers in TESOL teaching, publishing, and exams operations, aiming to secure placements for graduates of the program. Students and alumni of the program receive support from the Deree Office of Career Services, which helps them expand their professional network and gain access to an international database of job positions and career opportunities. Furthermore, they benefit from the Alba Graduate Business School services, which include career coaching, participation in career events and workshops, participation in the Alba annual career forum, one-to-one career advice sessions, direct mail list for job posts and career advice.

Admission to Program

Applicants should be able to demonstrate competence to undertake graduate work:

- A college or university degree
- Evidence of proficiency in the English language: TOEFL, IELTS, Proficiency, or GCE
- Motivation and/or relevant experience to specialize in this area. Evidence of strong motivation to work in the field of teaching English to speakers of other languages (TESOL) will be sought in the interview and the personal statement submitted with the application form.

Tuition & Scholarships

Deree strives to provide opportunities to students regardless of their ability to finance their education. For this reason, we offer scholarships to all applicants who have demonstrated exceptional academic performance. A discount policy is also available for organizations and ACG alumni.
