(Previously DR 2101 Movement for Acting II) (Updated Fall 2015)

PREREQUISITES: DR 2010 Movement for the Stage

CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

Study of the use of movement specifically in text based performance. Exploration of the inter-relationship of the use of

movement in acting, directing, and design.

RATIONALE: The course looks specifically at the role of movement for theatre

performance. Comparative analyses of movement strategies and

their application for actors, directors and designers.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

As a result of taking this course, the student should be able to:

- Understand the role of movement in the shaping of text-based performance.
- Apply a variety of movement strategies to define dramatic intention, aims and objectives of a character
- 3. Experiment with a variety of ways to link voice to physical action.
- Demonstrate ability to apply a variety of movement strategies to establish a dynamic scenic world for characters and audience.
- Develop ability to analyse and reflect on their performance and that of others utilizing key terminology effectively.

# METHOD OF TEACHING AND LEARNING:

In congruence with the teaching and learning strategy of the college, the following tools are used:

- Classes consist of exercises, lectures, and problem solving sessions, presentations of course-work and group discussions.
- Students will keep a journal of out-of-class movement investigations
- Screening of theatre and dance performances
- Office hours: students are encouraged to make full use of the office hours of their instructor, where they can ask questions and go over lecture and reading material.
- Use of a Blackboard site, where instructors post lecture notes, assignment instructions, timely announcements, as well as additional resources.
