CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

The final project is an opportunity for students to design, manage and complete an independent research project. The project can be fully theoretical or combine aspects of theory and practice. Opportunity to explore the ideas behind the concept of practice-based research, namely how investigation into the materials, forms, structures and rules of dance develops new knowledge in, within and through the discipline.

RATIONALE:

The students are given a forum to elaborate knowledge gained in an area from the taught course but adapted to specific, personal and professional aims. The final project can engage with 'practice' in a variety of modes: acting, directing, designing, writing, in-depth scholarly research, lecture/demonstrations, and electronic forms of dissemination. The student will gain experience of means available to disseminate research-outcomes. The course supports transition to professional work and/or graduate studies

## **LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

As a result of taking this course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Design and elaborate an extensive research project and consider the manner in which knowledge stemming from the process is disseminated.
- 2. Demonstrate capacity to work independently through the application of various techniques, in order to consolidate a working method/methodology.
- 3. Demonstrate an ability to self-critique and reflection in order to develop as an artist and a person.
- 4. Demonstrate an insight into the context of their work including representing their ideas concretely.
- 5. Demonstrate ability to engage in critical reflection and discussion, contributing to dialogue with others.
- 6. Make use of a variety of platforms/for a to disseminate the research outcomes
