CATALOG DESCRIPTION:	Greece's external relations. Policy orientation, alliances, partnerships and rivalries. Greece's role and influence in the region and beyond.	
RATIONALE:	This course leads the student to a critical understanding of the aspirations and principles guiding Greece's policies and actions since 1880. With the help of theoretical tools and historical insights, it enables the student to analyze Greece's relations with her neighbours, partners and allies, and appraise Greece's role and influence in Southeastern Europe, the Eastern Mediterranean, Europe and the wider international stage. The case of Greece presents great interest from the point of view of International Relations theory, foreign policy analysis, international economics, energy, International Law, history, culture, and the politics of conflict and conflict-resolution.	
LEARNING OUTCOMES:	 As a result of taking this course, the students should be able to: Explain how Greece's cultural, geographic and political characteristics have helped shape (i) its sovereignty, identity, security and geo-political concerns and objectives, and (ii) its standing in the region and the world Analyze and evaluate the various policy instruments at the disposal of Greece: diplomacy, economic diplomacy, civil-society exchanges, soft and hard power. Appraise the importance of various critical historical moments in Greece's development as a modern European state, and evaluate the implications of the foreign-policy choices associated therewith. 	
METHOD OFTEACHING AND LEARNING:	In congruence with the teaching and learning strategy of the college, the following tools are used: - Classes consist of lectures and interactive learning (class discussions on contemporary as well as historical cases). - Office hours: Students are encouraged to make full use of the office hours of their instructor, where they can discuss the course material. - Use of a Blackboard site, where instructors can post lecture notes assignment instructions, timely announcements, and additional resources. - Use of library facilities: Students are encouraged to make use of the library facilities for further study as well as for preparation for the exams.
