The course introduces students to edge computing, an important branch of distributed computing and IoT with significant applications in Data Science. It further discusses the associated concepts of fog and cloud **RATIONALE:** computing and exposes students to modern tools and APIs for use and deployment of relevant infrastructures. As a result of taking this course, the student should be able to: 1. Explore the need for new computing paradigms. 2. Explain major components of fog and edge computing architectures. **LEARNING OUTCOMES:** 3. Identify potential technical challenges of the transition process and suggest solutions. 4. Analyze data and application requirements and pertaining issues. 5. Design and model infrastructures.
