CATALOG DESCRIPTION:	The course offers individual instrumental/vocal instruction, to further the development of musical understanding, creativity and a range of technical and interpretive skills established in MU 1051 Applied I. In addition to weekly lessons, students gain valuable performance experience at the Music Forum Performance Lab. Previous instrumental/vocal training is required. Does not satisfy the humanities requirement.	
RATIONALE:	This course provides the individual instruction required for the development of skills instrumental/vocal performance. Students prepare and present a performances and develop reflective writing skills. The minimum standard of proficiency as reflected in repertoire selections is aligned with but not limited to ABRSM Grade 6. More advanced repertoire is encouraged and may be selected from other sources.	
LEARNING OUTCOMES:	After successfully completing this course, students should be able to: 1. Demonstrate the ability to perform appropriate assigned repertoire, showing f technical skills, and musical and stylistic understanding. 2. Show progress in the development of music performance practice. 3. Define and discuss goals, progress and musical practice. 4. Engage in the Music Forum activities and events, demonstrating understanding communication, presentation and performance etiquette skills.
