DESCRIPTION:**

Development of a research proposal for the final-year project, including (a) identification of the research problem; (b) theoretical background to the research problem and critical literature review; (c) objectives of the research proposal; (d) research design; (e) significance of the research; (f) ethics

RATIONALE:

The purpose of the research proposal is to ensure that the student has a thorough understanding of the literature and methods relevant to the intended study, and that the student has used this understanding to develop a high-quality plan for the Final Year Project. Specifically, the research proposal should highlight the theoretical framework and the rationale for the study and incorporate research methodology to address the research questions.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon completion of this module, the student should be able to:

1. Discover and pursue a research topic.
2. Demonstrate the ability to conduct literature review and gather the critical scientific information related to the research topic.
3. Formulate research hypotheses/questions that are clearly linked to the research topic and describe the relevant research design.
4. Demonstrate competency in oral communication and time management skills.
5. Apply ethical standards and academic integrity throughout the research process.

**METHOD OF TEACHING AND
