## In Memoriam: Dr. John S. Bailey Chancellor Emeritus, Chancellor, President The American College of Greece

Dr. John S. Bailey, a leading figure in Greek independent education for four decades, died on New Year's Eve, December 31, 2018 in Athens. He was 89.

Born in Elmhurst, Illinois in 1929, John S. Bailey was the son of an educator mother and a businessman father. Relocating with his family to Boston (MA) for high school, he distinguished himself as a student-athlete, becoming Eastern New England shot put champion. Earning an undergraduate degree from Boston University and MBA from Northeastern University, he served in the U.S. military as a combat infantry officer in the Korean War and was awarded the U.S. Legion of Merit, Bronze Star for Valor and Combat Infantryman Badge, the France Croix de Guerre and the Korea Military Service Medal.

After teaching business at Northeastern, he was appointed Assistant to renowned President, Asa S. Knowles and, later, Dean of University College, the university's largest division. In 1969 he became President of Nasson College (Maine), a position he held until accepting the presidency of The American College of Greece in 1975.

Joining The American College of Greece as its ninth president during the early and formative years of its independence from the founding sponsorship of the United Church of Christ, President Bailey's leadership positively impacted the College for generations to come. His tenure witnessed an unprecedented period of institutional growth, development and achievement.

President Bailey's leadership contributions positioned the institution for a significant and secure future, including: adoption of the College's official name – The American College of Greece; incorporation of The American University of Greece in the U.S. as a means of generating philanthropic support for the College and in anticipation of the eventual change of Article 16 to permit private universities in Greece; recruitment of distinguished volunteers to serve as members of the Board of Trustees; attaining accreditation by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges – the first U.S. college or university abroad to be regionally accredited; transformative development of the College's physical facilities, including the main campus, Downtown Campus and Plaka Building; achievement of the highest enrollment in the College's history; exponentially growing the College's endowment and reserve funds, thereby helping to assure the institution's financial viability.

His keen interest in the arts inspired President Bailey's vision for the College both in the academic programs and the extraordinary campus he developed. He cultivated a relationship with U.S. sculptor Frances Rich, which ultimately led to a donation that endowed the College's Frances Rich School of Fine and Performing Arts. In an interview with ACG Magazine in the summer of 2008, he stated: "This is one of the most beautiful countries you can find; you can see trees and beautiful flowers, so we have used indigenous workers, stone masons and sculptors, and have a campus filled with art. Students should have art in their lives, places for music and places for recreation."

*"The 19<sup>th</sup> century New England poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow wrote: 'When a great man dies, for years the light he leaves behind him, lies on the paths of men.' Jack Bailey was a great man. And his life and the light from it that shines on us all today will surely be a source of inspiration when we think of him in the days, weeks, months and years ahead ... It was Jack who willed this great College and all it represents to become the standard of excellence in Greece ... When I think of all the Americans who have played a role in building our long friendship with the Greek people over the last century, I think first of Jack ... When I arrived as President Clinton's Ambassador in Greece, Jack was one of the very first people I met. We shared a common identity as Irish-Americans from the 'Athens of America'— Boston. We gloried in the Red Sox. And we were fast friends. Libby and I loved Jack's ever-present smile, his openness, his love of laughter. His love of life. Truth be told, he was not just a friend. He was also a mentor for whom I will always be grateful."*

At a ceremony in honor of Dr. and Mrs. Bailey in June 2008, Trustee Jon Westling paid tribute to his unique role in the institution's history by describing Dr. Bailey as a *de facto* "founder" of the College. In recognition of their contributions to the College, the Board of Trustees named the College Library the John S. Bailey Library and the College's outdoor amphitheater the Irene Bailey Theater. In July 2008, Dr. Bailey became the College's first Chancellor and upon his retirement in 2012 was named ACG's first Chancellor Emeritus.

A highlight of Dr. Bailey's presidency was the hosting of the U.S. Olympic Team for the 2004 Athens Olympics. U.S. athletes credited the College's superb facilities with their outstanding competitive performance in the Olympic Games. Another highlight of his presidency was the creation of The College Chapel of the Three Hierarchs, dedicated in 1999 by His All Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew and Archbishop of Athens and All Greece Christodoulos. On January 5, 2019 hundreds of the College's faculty, staff, alumni and friends attended the funeral service for Dr. Bailey in the Chapel. They commented fondly in the reception following on their recollections of an empathetic, encouraging leader, whose work ethic, vision and belief in the goodness of others provided thousands of staff and students with the opportunity and inspiration to achieve successes of their own. As a symbol of respect and appreciation, College flags were flown at half-mast until January 31, 2019.

Dr. Bailey's leadership extended and was widely recognized well beyond ACG, including as a founder, President and President Emeritus of the Association of American International Colleges and Universities. Among the many awards he received were: the Commemorative Medal of the City of Athens in recognition of his dedication to Greek education and his contribution to the advancement of learning in the City of Athens; the Finis Engleman Award for distinguished leadership in international higher education; the award for Leadership in International Education by the Association of State Colleges and Universities (Washington, D.C.). He was awarded honorary doctorates by Northeastern University, Nasson College, New England College and The American College of Greece. In recognition of his devotion to the Church, he was declared an Archon Protonotarios of the Ecumenical Throne by His All Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew.

John S. Bailey was preceded in death by his son, Stephen, and his grandson, Chris, and is survived by his loving wife, Irene Korre-Bailey, four children, Laurel, Alexander, Philip and Oliver, and a grandchild, Elliot.

A 40 Day Memorial Service will be held on February 16, 2019 at 11:00 at the ACG College Chapel.

May his memory be eternal.






ACG FALL TOTAL ENROLLMENT



ANNUAL GRADUATES (HEADCOUNT)




UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC MIX (HIGH-SCHOOL GRADE, NEW STUDENTS)


## From Pierce classrooms and basketball courts to MIT!






## DEREE 2018 TOP TEN UNDERGRADUATE MAJORS



## DEREE 2018 GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS





## Business Week 2018



## ALBA 2018 FALL ENROLLMENT BY PROGRAM




## Transformative Teaching

During his speech Executive Dean Axaroglou pointed out that " Learning agility, the ability to learn, adapt and apply ourselves in constantly changing, first-time conditions is an attitude towards learning, necessary to manage effectively the disruptive nature of our environment."



## Application to the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB)

In September 2018, Alba submitted its accreditation application to AACSB. The process is expected to take up to five years but would result in AGBS being the first AACSB accredited program in Greece.



This Greek school has a novel solution to problem faced by many small Jewish communities



In Athens’ dwindling Jewish community, now at about 3,000 members, there simply aren’t enough children to support a Jewish middle or high school. So community leaders came up with a unique solution: a special Jewish track at the prestigious American College of Greece, a private school founded by Christian missionaries in 1875 with a middle school and high school division called Pierce.

“We are very happy to have this program here in Greece,” said Nina Negrin, whose 12-year-old daughter, Melina, attends the school. “For many years there was no continuation of Jewish education after age 12. Anything to do with Judaism just stopped suddenly. Now they continue their Jewish education and they stay together. These things are very important to us, not only as parents but also as members of the Jewish community.”

The project, known as the Pierce Jewish Studies Program, combines Jewish studies with informal educational activities like field trips to nearby synagogues. This special partnership between Pierce and the Jewish community ensures that the Jewish kids get spots at the competitive school, and tuition subsidies from the Ronald S. Lauder Foundation of 25 to 100 percent ensure they can afford it.

The destruction and devastation following in the wake of the July 2018 Attica wildfires touched the ACG community deeply. The College's response to the wildfires included the following:


- Offering College's facilities to those in need – seven families were hosted on campus for 10 to 40 days






## Development and Alumni Relations

### Waste monitoring project

As part of the ongoing waste monitoring project, a marked 5.6-fold increase in the quality of recycled material (lowest recorded proportion: from 11% correctly recycled masses in December 2017s to 62% in December 2018) was recorded for general recyclables (Blue recycling bins) and a 1.7- fold increase (39% in December 2017 to 67% in December 2018) for paper recyclables (Yellow bins).



### ACG & 'Boroume' Collaboration: 'ACG Farmers' Market'

In November 2018, ACG signed an MOU with NGO 'Boroume' through which the Center of Excellence for Sustainability (CES) and the Office of Public Affairs have 'adopted' a local farmers' market. A group of volunteers (ACG students, faculty, and staff) gather surplus products from the market's vendors on a weekly basis. This volunteer initiative helps eliminate food waste while contributing to a philanthropic cause, since all goods gathered are donated to a shelter for young girls and the local soup kitchen (Koinoniko Mageirio) supported by the local church. In just two months, ACG gathered over 1,400 kg of fruits and vegetables offering 74 hours of community service.








### ACG FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS (HEADCOUNT)
