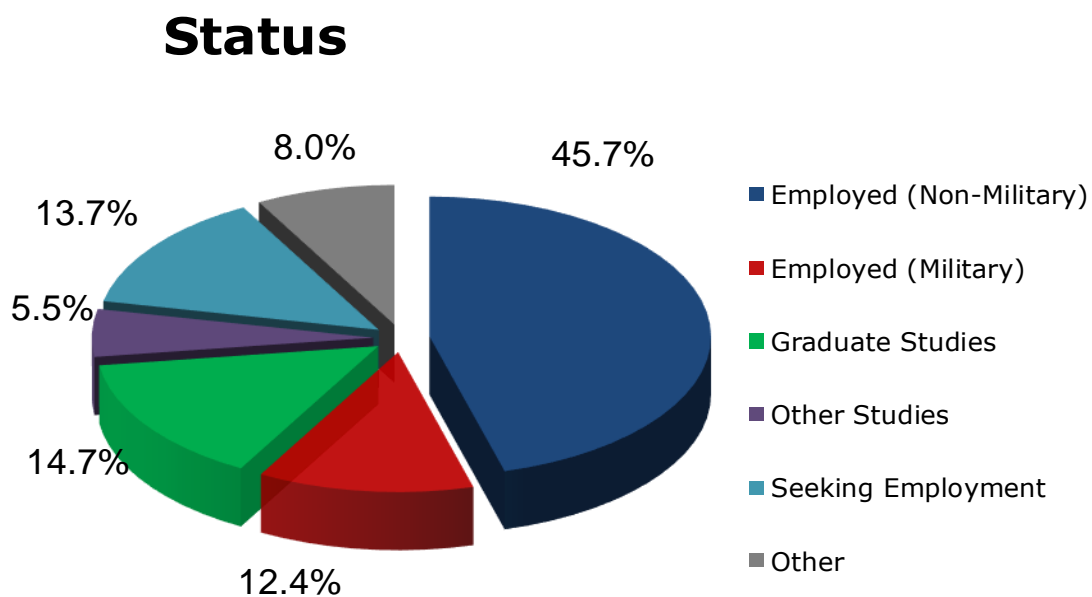


Post-Graduation Survey – Class of 2020 Initial Career Outcomes: The survey was administered in January 2021 (six months after graduation). A knowledge rate* of 91.8% (549/598) was obtained for Class 2020 career outcomes. Results showed that (last year’s results in parenthesis):

- **58.1%** are employed – working & serving in the military. Working: 45.7%, Military 12.4% (68.1, Working: 59.4%, Military: 8.7%). 41% of those Working are on a full-time basis and 4.7% on a part-time basis.
- **20.2%** are pursuing studies – Graduate Studies: 14.7% (20.4% - Graduate Studies: 14.3%)
- **13.7%** are not working and looking for a job (8.7%)
- **8%** other (2.8%). Other includes 6.6% Planning to continue education but not yet enrolled, 0.9% Not seeking employment or continuing education and 0.5% Participating in a volunteer or service program).

Class 2020 has a **79.6% Career Outcomes Rate**, meaning percentage of graduates with a known positive career outcome such as being Employed/working full time or part-time, Serving in the Military, Studying or Participating in a volunteering or service program.

**Knowledge rate* is defined as the percentage of graduates for which the institution has reasonable and verifiable information concerning the graduates’ postgraduation career activities. (NACE)

Data collection for Class 2020 was aligned to the **Career Outcomes Reporting Categories** included in the [Standards and Protocols for the Collection and Dissemination of Graduating Students Initial Career Outcomes Information for Undergraduates](#), National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE), July 2019. In lieu of the term *placement rate* these standards focus on *career outcomes rate*.
