The physical theatre performance "The Doubles", based on Jean Genet's play "The Maids", portrays two sisters who have been maids their entire lives. Whenever their madam is away, they engage in a role-playing ritual, where one performs the madam and the other the maid. In Eryfili Drakopoulou's and Sabina Andrea Allen's adaptation (Corpus Franca Company), the dynamics change, and the borders that shape their identities in relation to each other become blurred. Then, the real question is: if you are me and I am you, who is the other?

Black Box Theatre

Under the direction of our current student Christoforos Vogiatzis, "Encomium", comprised by two of Caryl Churchill's latest works ("Bluebeard's Friends" and "Kill"), attempts to explore how we respond to atrocity, under the lens of crimes committed against femininities. Internalization of brutality and its subsequent glorification take center stage, as the line between spectacle and spectator is discarded, mirroring a society of voyeurism and collective responsibility.

IN TERMS OF MOVEMENT By Dr. Kiki Selioni

This workshop will tackle the textual reading of Aeschylus' tragedy "Agamemnon" in terms of movement. It will explore the ways in which dramaturgical analysis can be treated as a living process of performance production rather than a process of reading. Through the prism of the Aristotelian principles as presented in the Poetics, and through practical application of Laban's movement analysis, the workshop will attempt to recreate performance conditions while reading the tragedy. A presentation of human praxis, the play, ought to be treated as a living creation even during the actors' training. The ultimate objective is to investigate a dramaturgical methodology on the actor's training, aiming to combine theoretical knowledge and its practical application. This workshop is part of Dr. Selioni's postdoctoral research entitled 'Laban Acting Technique: Biophysical Acting 2022-2025'. Participation is free - limited number of participants.
