SCHOLARSHIPS FOR NEW ENTERING STUDENTS

ACG has a long tradition of providing scholarships (full or partial tuition reduction) to students who distinguish themselves academically and/or face financial need, with the help of generous donors who believe in the transformative value of quality education.

REQUIREMENTS THAT APPLY TO ALL SCHOLARSHIPS:

- Meet all entrance requirements for admission to the College and be an entering-incoming degree-seeking student.
- Have a minimum high school diploma grade of 17/20 and above (or equivalent).
- Demonstrate financial need (only for need-based scholarships).
- Show academic promise.

NOTE: Any additional requirements for each specific scholarship are listed below.

NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

To be included in the evaluation process, all prospective students must submit the Online Deree Need-Based Scholarships Application and the Online Deree Need-Based Grants Application along with all required documents (you may refer to the How to Apply section at the end of the leaflet).

SCHOLARSHIPS BY REGION

Joy G. Korologos Memorial Scholarship - Prefecture of Arcadia, Peloponnese

Two scholarships of 100% tuition reduction given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- have parents who reside in the district of Kynouria in the prefecture of Arcadia, Peloponnese (If there are no candidates from this district, applicants from other districts of Arcadia will be considered; proof of parent's residence is required.)
- have graduated from a lyceum in one of the designated areas.

George Agorogiannis and Paraskevi Menegatou Parafestas - Ionian Islands and/or Prefecture of Thessaly

Award amount given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- be residents or have families which decent from the island of Kefalonia and/or Larissa. If there are no eligible candidates from Kefalonia or Larissa, applicants from all the Ionian islands and the Thessaly prefecture will be considered. If there are no eligible candidates from these areas, then candidates from any part of Greece will be considered.

George Mavroudis and Maria Vassiliadis - Macedonia Prefecture

Award amount given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years

Applicants must:

- have parents who resides or descent from the area of Serres. If there are no such eligible candidates, then candidates from the greater Macedonia prefecture will be considered. If there are no such qualified candidates, then candidates from any part of Greece will be considered.

Alexandros Zekakos and Vera Menegatou - Ionian Islands and/or Peloponnese Prefecture and/or Attiki Prefecture

Award amount given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years

Applicants must:

- have parents who resides or descent from the islands of Kefalonia and/or the areas of Mani and/or Athens. If there are no such eligible candidates, then candidates from all the Ionian Islands, the Peloponnese and the Attiki prefectures will be considered. If there are no such qualified candidates, then candidates from any part of Greece will be considered.

Aristomenis Koulalis & Anthoula Menegatou – Ionian Islands and/or North Aegean Islands and/or Attica Prefecture

Award amount given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years

Applicants must:

- have parents who resides or descent from the islands of Kefalonia and/or Mytilene and/or the area of Piraeus. If there are no such qualified candidates, then candidates from all the Ionian islands, the North Aegean islands and the Attiki prefectures will be considered. If there are no such qualified candidates, then candidates from any part of Greece will be considered.

George and Penelope Nicholas - Prefecture of Corinth, Peloponnese

Award amount given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- have graduated from a lyceum in the city of Corinth in the prefecture of Corinthia and whose parents reside in that city. If there are no candidates from the city of Corinth, applicants from other areas of the Corinthia prefecture will be considered. In any other case, students from any part of Greece will be considered.

Eleftherios and Mary Rouvelas Endowed - Prefecture of Laconia, Peloponnese

Award amount given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- have graduated from a lyceum in Archangellos or Monemvasia in the prefecture of Laconia, or if none, from Elika, Demonias, Moali, Monemvasia or Neapoli, or if none, from other towns or villages of Laconia, or if none, from any other area of Greece.

T.K. Zampetis Family Foundation Scholarship – Island of Samos

One scholarship of 100% tuition reduction plus Room & Board given for maximum of 4 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- be residents of the island of Samos.
- have completed secondary education in one of the Lyceums on the island of Samos.
- show proficiency in English (qualify to take WP1010 Introduction to Academic Writing upon entrance to the college).

SCHOLARSHIPS BY MAJOR

A.C. Laskaridis Foundation Scholarships for Entrepreneurship Management Majors

Award amounts given for one academic year with the possibility of renewal.

Applicants must:

- pursue a BSc degree in Entrepreneurship Management.

Kallisti Non-Profit Expendable Scholarship for Music Majors

Award amount given for maximum of 4 continuous years

Applicants must:

- pursue a BA in Music

Seanergy Maritime Holdings Corp. Expendable Scholarship in Shipping Management

Award amount given for maximum of 4 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- show proficiency in English (qualify to take WP1010 Introduction to Academic Writing upon entrance to the college).
- pursue a BSc degree in Shipping Management.

United Maritime Corporation Expendable Scholarship in Shipping Management

Award amount given for maximum of 4 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- show proficiency in English (qualify to take WP1010 Introduction to Academic Writing upon entrance to the college).

SCHOLARSHIPS BY OTHER SPECIFICATIONS

John S. Bailey Scholarship for Pierce Graduates

One scholarship of 100% tuition reduction given for maximum of 4.5 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- be Pierce graduates with a minimum high school grade of 17.

Eurobank Equities Expendable Scholarship for Financial Markets Trading Minors

Award amount given for a maximum of 3 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- pursue a certificate minor in "Financial Markets Trading".
- be currently enrolled at a Greek public University and have completed at least one semester with an academic average of 7.5/10 or above (or 7/10 or above for the National Technical University of Athens).

Scholarships for the areas of Thessaly that have been impacted by flooding

Two scholarships of 50% tuition reduction given for maximum of 6 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- be residents in the area of Thessaly.
 - hold a Greek Lyceum Apolytirion from the area of Thessaly with a minimum grade of 16/20.
 - present evidence that their primary residence has been affected by the floods.

MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

To be included in the evaluation process, all prospective students must submit the Online Deree Merit-Based Scholarships Application along with all required documents (you may refer to the How to Apply section at the end of the leaflet).

SCHOLARSHIPS BY MAJOR

The below listed scholarships, of 10% to 35% tuition reductions, are awarded through the Frances Rich School of Fine and Performing Arts for one year with the possibility of renewal.

Art History Scholarships for Art History Majors

Applicants must:

- pursue a BA degree in Art History.
- present evidence of knowledge in Art History; interview to be arranged with the Art History Department.

Graphic Design Scholarships for Graphic Design Majors

Applicants must:

- pursue a BA degree in Graphic Design.
- Present a portfolio of current work and participate in the scholarship call; interview to be arranged with the Graphic Design Department.

Music Scholarships for Music Majors

Applicants must:

- pursue a BA degree in Music.
- demonstrate advanced performance and/or academic/creative music skills through the submission of a portfolio of work or audition; interview/audition to be arranged with the Music Department.

Theater Arts Scholarships for Theater Arts Majors

Applicants must:

- pursue a BA degree in Theater Arts.
- Demonstrate knowledge of theater practice; interview to be arranged with the Theatre Arts Department.

Visual Arts Scholarships for Visual Arts Majors

Applicants must:

- pursue a BA degree in Visual Arts.
 - Present a portfolio of current work and participate in the scholarship call; interview to be arranged with the Visual Arts Department.

SCHOLARSHIPS BY OTHER SPECIFICATIONS

The Aldous Family Accessibility Expendable Scholarship for visually impaired students with a minimum percentage of blindness of 80%

One scholarship of 100% tuition reduction given for a maximum of 5 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- have completed his/her secondary education at a Greek lyceum with a high school grade of 15 and above (or equivalent).
- show proficiency in English (qualify to take WP1010 Introduction to Academic Writing upon entrance to the college).
- are visually impaired with a minimum percentage of blindness of 80%.

Pillars Scholarship for students who present evidence of volunteerism

Award amount given for a maximum of 4.5 continuous years.

Applicants must:

- have completed their secondary education at a lyceum with a Grade Point Index average of 75% for all three years (or equivalent). If applying as a freshman with 15 or fewer credits, the applicant must also provide an official transcript of his/her college work that shows a cumulative Grade Point Index of 75% or higher.
- have been a citizen of Greece for at least three years before application.
- present evidence of volunteer work contributions in social, political, and/or cultural activities outside the school environment.

NOTE: Preference will be given to descendants of US/Greek military retirees or veterans who also meet all the above requirements.

Deree Merit Scholarships, ranging from 10% to 35% tuition reductions, awarded based on high school academic performance, proficiency in English, and overall student profile.

Applicants must:

- have completed secondary education at a lyceum with a minimum high school grade of 17 and above (or equivalent).
- No application is required.

Affiliation Discount for Pierce Alumni Program of 50% tuition reduction.

Applicants must:

- be Pierce graduates who have completed all three years of Lyceum at Pierce.
- No application is required.

Athletic Scholarships

Deree – The American College of Greece offers gifted student-athletes the opportunity to participate in a highly developed sports program while simultaneously receiving a high-quality college education. Athletic scholarships of up to a 20% tuition reduction are awarded for one academic year with the possibility of renewal.

The Stavros Niarchos Foundation Scholarship Program for Minor-seeking Students

The Stavros Niarchos Foundation supports a scholarship program at Deree, as part of their "Recharging the Youth" initiative. This program allows students to pursue a minor alongside their Greek public University degree, broadening their education for future careers.

Applicants must:

- be currently enrolled in an undergraduate program at a Greek public University.
- have completed at least one semester at a Greek public University with an academic average of 7.5/10 (or 7/10 for the National Technical University of Athens).
- have a high school diploma grade of 17/20 and above.

EVALUATION PROCESS:

All completed applications are screened by the Scholarships Committee, which will compile a short list of qualified applicants. In the next and final stage, these applicants will be interviewed by the respective committee.

The Scholarships Committee reserves the right to:

- extend an annual scholarship to the same recipient, provided the said recipient continues to meet the eligibility requirements and has applied.
- award, to an applicant, a scholarship other than the one that the said applicant chose to apply for.

THE SCREENING IS BASED ON THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- Meeting of all the eligibility requirements for the relevant scholarship(s).
- Personal statement(s) by the applicant (which is included in the application).
- Recommendation letter / Curriculum Vitae (CV).
- Pre-recorded self-presentation (video).
- High School graduation grade and English language proficiency.
- Financial need demonstrated by submitting a "Need-based Financial Assistance - Grant" Application (only for need-based scholarships).

NOTE: Students seeking scholarships from the Frances Rich School of Fine and Performing Arts are not required to submit recommendation letters or a pre-recorded video. Evaluation of these scholarships is conducted by the School's dean, department heads, and faculty.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- The College reserves the right to adjust the academic criteria for financial assistance found on its website and on scholarship brochures.
- To continue receiving a scholarship, all recipients must adhere to the specific requirements outlined in each scholarship's description.
- Recipients of scholarships funded by donors must sign a commitment form acknowledging receipt of the scholarship and agreeing to fulfill associated obligations. These include submitting an annual thank-you letter or video to the donor, detailing their academic progress for the year.
- Financial Assistance is given for tuition only and does not include other fees (unless otherwise specified).
- Students on academic probation (CI below 2.00/4.00) are not eligible to receive any kind of financial assistance.
- Non-credit courses are not covered by the tuition reduction grant except for courses in the English for Academic Purposes Program (EAPP).
- Non-Degree students are not eligible to apply for any type of financial assistance.
